We'll also grow and expand The Link for Suppliers to increase the visibility of supplier maturity and online learning access. Finally, we'll establish a strong regional presence and extend our China and India pilots to other regions of the world.

Prof. Shih explained how the increasing specialization of manufacturers and growing complexity of supply chains over the past few decades had resulted in the shock caused by the pandemic to pharmaceutical supply chains this year. Supply Chain News and Emerging Issues

Launch of the Self-Initiated Audit Pilot and Remote Audit Program

To ensure audit continuity in the context of the Covid-19 pandemic, the PSCI has launched a supplier self-initiated audit (SSIA) pilot and a remote audit program. The new self-initiated audit (SSIA) program allows suppliers to start an audit that will be completed by an approved third-party firm and shared with members on the PSCI platform. This program is now open to all PSCI members and suppliers, remotely or onsite. SSIAs offer flexibility to suppliers, provide members with more supplier options, encourage suppliers to proactively identify risks and opportunities, may reduce the number and scale of future audits, and follow the rigorous PSCI audit process, guaranteeing high quality evaluations. Remote audits will count towards PSCI members' target of sharing five audits annually at a .5 weighting.

Emerging Topic Spotlight: Biodiversity

While climate change has captured public attention and risen to the top of political and corporate agendas, biodiversity has lagged behind. That is changing with growing appreciation that the world's biodiversity is critical to humanity's wellbeing and business profitability. The pharmaceutical industry has a unique imperative to protect biodiversity – natural resources (and genetic diversity) form the foundation of a wide range of medicines and are critical for the discovery and development of new chemical substances and active pharmaceutical ingredients. Our Partnerships

We are increasingly developing our local and global partnerships in China and India, and with key communication groups:

- **China:** We held two webinars in Mandarin this year on <u>combustible dust</u> and <u>respiratory</u> <u>protection</u>. We also launched our WeChat public account, which now has over 550 readers.
- India: We conducted a gap analysis to understand the potential contradictions between the recently enacted Indian labor laws and the PSCI Principles, and shared the results through a webinar.
- **CPhI**: We've continued our successful communications partnership with CPhI through a series of speaking engagements, awards judging, and quarterly blogs. Our members presented at the annual Festival of Pharma, presenting <u>an introduction to Pharmaceuticals</u> in the Environment (PiE) and anti-microbial resistance (AMR), and the Festival keynote speech on <u>redefining supply chain resiliency</u>.

Resource Guides

Raw Materials

The Human Rights & Labor Sub-Team has published responsible sourcing <u>guides</u> on nine raw materials (natural rubber, aluminium, shellac, glass, fish oil, castor oil, sugar, talc, and cellulose) that are of key importance to the pharmaceutical industry. Each factsheet details the production process and countries of production of the relevant material and the associated human rights impacts, as well as existing sustainability initiatives. In partnership with the Environment Sub-Team, those nine guides have since been updated to also cover potential environmental impacts, and guides about five new raw materials have been created. All 14 updated sourcing guides will be published soon.

Scope 3 Emissions Calculation Guidance

The Pharmaceutical Environment Group (PEG) and its participating companies have developed a <u>guide for calculating Scope 3 emissions</u> for pharmaceutical companies to be shared amongst PSCI members. The guide seeks to provide a consistent guidance for pharmaceutical companies to calculate greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions in their upstream and downstream value chains in line with the GHG Protocol methodology.
